A MESSAGE FROM THE ARTISTIC DIRECTOR

Beethoven's 9th Symphony is arguably the most famous, most revered, most performed and most beloved work in the classical music repertoire. It is also the first symphony to include text, and it is, perhaps, the choral "Ode to Joy" finale which is what draws generations of people to Beethoven's masterpiece. Schiller's stirring poem is a hymn to unity between peoples, and joy is the agent that will bring us together. We all should follow joy's trail of roses, Schiller tells us.

Beethoven's musical works speak about the heroic struggle of the individual against injustice and oppression. Beethoven believed that only through unity could humankind defeat hardship.

Co-choreographer, Robert Glumbek, knows about struggle and hardship first hand. He grew up in Communist Poland during the Cold War, and when the Polish National Ballet toured Canada in 1987, he defected in Toronto. Although it meant leaving his family behind, with only telephone contact available to him, Robert yearned for artistic and personal freedom. For him, Beethoven's 9th Symphony is more than a piece of music. He feels a personal connection on a very visceral level because he relates to its underlying theme of individual struggle.

My personal connection happened in 2011. While in Berlin, for work, I visited the exhibit that commemorates the fall of the Berlin Wall. One black and white video image made an indelible impression on me. The wall was just being built, and members of the same family were on different sides waving at each other. In particular, one little boy was jumping up and down trying to reach out to the other side. The families were so close they could almost touch each other, yet there was an ocean between them. That image haunts me to this day.

Creating The 9th!, as we call our piece, has been almost a decade long labour of love. Robert and I were determined to go slowly because we wanted more than just a physical response to the music. Our goal was to express the epic ideas and themes inherent in the symphony itself.

And now, at long last, we have completed all four movements, and we invite you, the audience, to join us in our journey through Beethoven's monumental masterpiece.

Oh friends, not these sounds! Let us instead strike up more pleasing and more joyful ones! Joy! Joy! Joy, beautiful spark of divinity, daughter from Elysium, We enter, burning with fervour, heavenly being, your sanctuary! Your magic brings together what custom has sternly divided. All men shall become brothers, wherever your gentle wings hover. Whoever has been lucky enough to become a friend to a friend, Whoever has found a beloved wife, let him join our songs of praise! Yes, and anyone who can call one soul his own on this earth! Any who cannot, let them slink away from this gathering in tears! Every creature drinks in joy at nature's breast; Good and evil alike follow her trail of roses. She gives us kisses and wine, a true friend, even in death; Even the worm was given desire, and the cherub stands before God. Gladly, just as His suns hurtle through the glorious universe, So you, brothers, should run your course, joyfully, like a conquering hero. Be embraced, you millions! This kiss is for the whole world! Brothers, above the canopy of stars must dwell a loving father. Do you bow down before Him, you millions? Do you sense your Creator, O world? Seek Him above the canopy of stars! He must dwell beyond the stars.



ROBERTO CAMPANELLA Artistic Director / Co-choreographer



ROBERT GLUMBEK Associate Director / Co-choreographer

Born in Rome, Roberto Campanella trained at the Scuola Italiana di Danza Contemporanea. He began his career with Compagnia Italiana di Danza Contemporanea and the prestigious Aterballetto. In 1993, he joined The National Ballet of Canada as a Soloist, excelling in classical and contemporary roles. Roberto debuted as a choreographer at the 1995 National Ballet of Canada's Choreographic Workshop and retired in 1996 to pursue choreography and teaching. A graduate of the National Ballet School's Teacher Training Program with distinction, he co-founded ProArteDanza in 2004, cultivating its reputation for bold innovation, blending contemporary and classical influences, and mentoring emerging artists. Roberto's choreography has earned widespread recognition. He received the Dora Mavor Moore Award for In Between (2010), the Fellowship Initiative Award from the New York City Ballet Choreographic Institute (2007), and a Chalmers Professional Development Grant (2008). Beyond the stage, Roberto has choreographed for film and TV, contributing to The Strain, Silent Hill, Academy Award winner film, The Shape of Water, and more. ProArteDanza is celebrated for its "passion in performance" and for pushing artistic boundaries while fostering inclusivity and education.

After graduating from Bytom State Ballet School in Poland, Robert Glumbek joined The Great Theatre of Opera and Ballet in Warsaw. In 1987, Glumbek came to Canada and worked for companies including Theatre Ballet of Canada, Ottawa; Judith Marcuse Company, Vancouver; and Myth Productions - before dancing with Desrosiers Dance Theatre (1990 – 2000). Glumbek has appeared in works, most notably: Greece's 1998 Gala des Etoiles festival with Karen Kain, directed by Dominique Dumais; the role of Mars, Canadian Opera Company's 2001 production of Venus and Adonis, choreographed by Serge Bennathan; and 32 Silver Pieces, DanceMakers, choreographed by Marie Josee Cartier (Dora winner). Robert has worked with choreographers: Kevin O'Day, Bill James, Peter Chin, Michael Downing (Dancefront), Dominique Dumais, Christopher House, Serge Bennathan, Holly Small, Learie McNicolls, and Tedd Robinson. Robert became Artistic Associate of ProArteDanza in 2004 where he has since created a number of acclaimed original works. Robert has also created works for Mannheim Ballett, Ballett Vorpommern, Ballet British Columbia, princess productions, Toronto Dance Theatre, Opera na Zamku w Szczecin, L'École supérieure de ballet du Québec, Hamilton Conservatory for the Arts, CCDT, Arts Umbrella, York University and Ryerson University, where he is also a faculty member for over 10 years. Awards include: finalist in the Hanover Choreographic Competition and Stuttgart Choreographic Competition; recipient of the Now Magazine award for Best Dancer of the Year (2006); K.M. Hunter Artist Award; Clifford E. Lee Choreography Award; and Jan Kiepura award for best choreographer in Poland. Robert is currently performing on tour as King Claudius in the Robert Lepage and Guillaume Côté creation of The Tragedy of Hamlet: Prince of Denmark.

Demetri Apostolopoulos, born and raised in Winnipeg, Manitoba, is a dancer, choreographer, Pilates enthusiast and intuitively driven artist. Now based in Toronto, he has recently graduated with Distinction from Toronto Metropolitan University (formerly Ryerson) with a BFA in Performance Dance. Since joining TMU, Demetri has worked with Alysa Pires, Daileidys Carrazana, Guillaume Côté, Julia Cratchley, Kelly Shaw, Rodney Diverlus and Vicki St-Denys. He is recognized for his exceptional promise for a distinguished career in performance as the nominee for the Hnatyshyn Award for contemporary dance and is the recipient of the Orly Watkin and Nick Cordero Awards. Mr. Apostolopoulos has attended Orsolina28, Arts Umbrella International Summer Intensive and Rutherford Movement Exchange, where he has expanded his repertoire knowledge of known works of Crystal Pite, Jiří Kylián, Marcos Morau, Medhi Walerski, Sharon Eyal, and Roy Assef. Most recently, Demetri performed at the prestigious Fall for Dance North Festival with Malpaso Dance Company in their signature program, as well as Côté Danses Toronto premiere of their new creation of Burn Baby, Burn.

Griffen Grice is a Toronto based artist who takes passion in dance. He began training in competitive dance at the age of 12 and this ignited his passion for dance artistry. Griffen has completed his dance education at Toronto Metropolitan University and earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in the Performance Dance program. Griffen has performed in numerous live dance shows as part of the TMU Dance program and worked with choreographers such as Louis Laberge-Cote and Rock Bottom Movement led by Alyssa Martin. He has had the opportunity to work with Gibney Company artistic associate Jesse Obremski in the contemporary dance piece titled LightPrint, featured in the Fall For Dance North 2023 Signature Program. Griffen is a dancer on the Argos A-Team and performs at CFL games at BMO Field. Most recently, Griffen has performed with Côté Danse in a piece titled Burn Baby, Burn by Guillaume Côté at the Saint-Sauveur Arts Festival and the 2024 Fall For Dance North festival in Toronto.



SARAH DI IORIO Performer

Sarah Di Iorio is a movement artist holding a Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree from Toronto Metropolitan University. She has performed at renowned dance festivals such as Jacob's Pillow and Le Festival des Arts de Saint-Sauveur, and has toured with Red Sky Performance across North America. Her newest creation, Meet You At The Surface, recently made its debut in the Night Shift 2024 festival, co-presented by Citadel + Compagnie and Fall For Dance North.
