CAMPANELLA

Roberto Campanella was born, raised, trained and started his professional dance career in Rome, Italy. Roberto danced with renowned companies such as Aterballeto and National Ballet of Canada. Since 2004 Roberto has been the founding Artistic Director of contemporary dance company ProArteDanza. Roberto is now a sought-after guest teacher and award-winning choreographer for theatre, film and tv. Campanella was awarded the Empire Community Award from the Italian Contemporary Film Festival for his work on the Oscar winning film "The Shape Of



ROBERT GLUMBEK

Upon graduation from Bytom State Ballet School in Poland, Robert Glumbek joined The Great Theatre of Opera and Ballet in Warsaw as a soloist. In 1987, Glumbek went to Canada and worked for Theatre Ballet of Canada, Desrosiers Dance Theatre and from 2002-2004 as dancer and ballet master for Mannheim Ballet, Germany. Upon returning to Canada, he began co-choreographing with Robert Campanella and became Artistic Associate for ProArteDanza in 2006. Robert is currently a full time faculty member at the Toronto Metropolitan University. He's the recipient of Now Magazine's Best Dancer, K.M. Hunter Artist Award and Clifford E. Lee Choreography Award. Robert is a four-time Dora Mayor Moore nominee, and co-recipient winner with Roberto Campanella for "... in between..." (2010).



JERA WOLFE

Born in Tkaronto/Toronto, Jera Wolfe is a choreographer and performer and a member of the Manitoba Métis Federation. His captivating choreography has awarded him the 2019 Dora Mayor Moore Award for Outstanding Original Choreography for Trace by Red Sky Performance. He has demonstrated an impressive repertoire of works presented by Canadian Stage, National Arts Centre, Fall For Dance North, Banff Centre for Arts and Creativity, Festival des arts de Saint-Sauveur, Citadel + Compagnie, Danse Danse, and Jacob's Pillow. As a performer Jera has danced for Red Sky Performance as well as Peggy Baker Dance Projects. He is also the lead performer in PISUWIN with Atlantic Ballet.



SASHA LUDAVICIUS

Sasha Ludavicius is a professional Contemporary dance artist and teacher in Toronto. In 2016, she graduated from the School of Toronto Dance Theatre and started working with ProArteDanza in 2015. She has danced with Peggy Baker Dance Projects, Red Sky Performance, The Chimera Project and Hit&Run Dance Productions. Sasha has been the Training Manager and Rehearsal Director for ProArte's Summer Intensive Program (SIP) since 2020. Additionally, she rehearsal directed for Canadian Contemporary Dance Theatre in 2022. Her passion for movement influenced her to become a Fitness and Pilates instructor, a personal trainer as well as a certified Yoga/Barre instructor. During this past year, she offered Contemporary dance workshops and choreographed in performing art high schools across Toronto.



KRISTA DOWSON

Krista Dowson retired from the National Ballet of Canada after a fulfilling 14 year career. She remains situated within the dance world, designing and building costumes. She has had the pleasure of designing costumes for James Kudelka's Psalms and Canticles, part of Canada's National Ballet School's Spring Showcase, The National Ballet of Canada's production of Guillaume Cote's Being and Nothingness, as well as designing and building the costumes for Toronto Dance Theatre's production of Alyssa Martin's Bin Chicken, Citadel + Compagnie's Julie En L'Univers, Robert Stephen's ballet adaptation of Kat Sandler's Mustard for Ballet Kelowna, and the Bicycle Opera Company's film Sweat. Krista is the Resident Costume Designer and Producer for Canadian Contemporary Dance Theatre and has a long standing creative relationship with ProArteDanza. Costumes help artists share stories that matter.



NOAH FEAVER

Noah Feaver is a Dora Award nominated lighting designer. He works frequently in Dance and Opera and has designed for companies such as: The National Ballet of Canada, Edmonton Opera, Toronto Dance Theatre, Tapestry Opera, Soulpepper Theatre Company, Holla Jazz, Citadel + Compagnie, The Royal Conservatory of Music, Against the Grain Theatre, and Rock Bottom Movement. Noah holds a BFA from Toronto Metropolitan University's Performance Production program and spent two summers as a lighting design practicum at The Banff Centre. He works as a Lighting Design Coach at The National Theatre School of Canada. Noah is a member of the Associated Designers of Canada.



MARILYN LULA

Marilyn Lula is a young dancer who was born and raised in Mississauga. Her dance journey began by dancing competitively in various styles. Marilyn discovered a true passion filled with intrigue for further contemporary and professional training in 2022 when she first attended ProArteDanza's SIP. This program was a place where she not only acquired so much knowledge and insight about her artistry, but also had the opportunity to perform repertoire and engage with professional artists. At the end of SIP 24, Marilyn was awarded the Apprentice company contract to dance with ProArte for their 2024 fall season. As this is her grade 12 year in high school, the chance to be a part of something prestigious and special will only positively guide her into the future as an aspiring professional dancer. Marilyn is beyond appreciative for such an opportunity, and can not wait for this season to begin.



CONNOR MITTON

Connor Mitton graduated from Toronto Metropolitan University's Dance Program in 2017. He is a three time nominee and recipient of the 2024 Dora Mavor Moore Award for outstanding performance by an ensemble in James Kudelka's "The Man in Black". In 2024 he started working in film and television as an assistant choreographer. Connor has toured with several companies including: Côté Dansé, Red Sky Performance, ProArteDanza, and Citadel et Compangnie. Recognized by Now Magazine as one of 2017's breakthrough Toronto stage artists. He has performed many pieces by Canadian choreographic icon James Kudelka, including: Fifteen Heterosexual Duets, The Man in Black, Romeo and Juliet before Parting, Soudain L'hiver Denier and Heros. He has also had the privilege of working with many other renowned choreographers and artists in Toronto.



JAKE POLOZ

Originally from Northern Alberta, Jake Poloz is a Montreal-based dancer & choreographer. He has performed works by Lesley Telford, Kirsten Wicklund, Guillaume Côté, John Alleyne, Cameron Fraser-Monroe, and Jessica Muszynski. He was a company dancer with ProArteDanza (2018–2022 & 2024), and Ballet Kelowna (2022–2024). Jake has performed with Alysa Pires Dance Projects, BoucharDanse, and was a member of the Dora-nominated ensemble of Human Body Expression's Resonance. As a choreographer, he was commissioned by Ballet Kelowna to create his work "The Royal We" (2023). His debut evening-length piece "i've seen you naked" was presented at The Westdale Theatre in Hamilton, and earlier, he served as choreographic assistant to Ryan Lee for his work with Toronto Metropolitan University. His work has been presented at The Garage and Dance Matters in Toronto, as well as Festival Quartiers Danse in Montreal where he received the Coup de Coeur Emerging Artist Prize. His work has been hailed as "athletic, preposterous and funny" as well as "finely tuned... fresh and thought provoking" by View Magazine.



PETRA TOOP

Petra Toop is a dancer from Oakville. She began training competitively in ballet, jazz, contemporary, and hip hop at the age of 8. It wasn't until 2016 when she participated in ProArte's Summer Intensive Program (SIP), that she found her passion for contemporary dance. She grew a strong appreciation and curiosity for the vulnerability, risk taking and athleticism that ProArteDanza demanded of their dancers. She continued to train at SIP for 3 more summers. While dancing and performing, Petra is completing her undergraduate degree in Bio-Medical Science at The University of Guelph. Her knowledge in biomechanics and kinesthetics inspires much of her movement dynamic. Most recently, Petra performed at Danzart Festival in Sicily, Italy, under the direction of Ermanno Sbezzo and Giovanni Insaudo.



WILLEM SADLER

Willem Sadler is a Hip Hop and contemporary creator based in Toronto. Willem has had the opportunity to perform and show his work Internationally. As a young dancer and performer, his drive has always come from his love for movement performance and his connection to music. Willem defines himself as a versatile dancer/creator and strives to squash the separation of 'styles' and present dance as movement without restrictions. Throughout his career Willem has performed and collaborated with the TSO, Mirvish, Little Pear Garden, Dusk Dances, Dance Collection Danse, Zata OMM, CCDT, ProArteDanza and Côté Danse. Willem has had the opportunity to perform as part of some of North America's most recognized dance festivals: Fall For Dance, Festival des Art de Saint-Sauveur and Fall For Dance North. Willem is deeply grateful for the opportunity to express freely as an artist and is committed to enhancing the vibrancy of the Toronto dance community. @willemsadler

Eleanor van Veen is a dance artist from Cape Breton Island, now based in Toronto, where she collaborates, performs, and teaches dance and Pilates. Driven by a desire for intuitive movement, her practice is an ever-evolving exploration of flow and feeling. Eleanor has performed works by Alysa Pires, Hanna Kiel, Lesley Telford, Meghann Michalsky, Naishi Wang, Nicole von Arx, Syreeta Hector, among others, and has worked with Edmonton Opera, Human Body Expression, Metamorphosis Dance, Near & Far Projects, Nostos Collectives, ProArteDanza, and Project InTandem. As a creator, Eleanor has shared and explored her work in settings including Woodland Farm's Artist Residency, Kinetic's Open Studio Series, Art & Water's Dockside Dance, and St. Elizabeth's Regional Arts Program.

Carleen Zouboules earned her BFA from Toronto Metropolitan University and is a versatile presence in the Toronto dance scene. Carleen has performed at Fall For Dance North in pieces by Jera Wolfe, Anne Plamondon, Guillaume Côté and danced works by James Kudelka, Lesley Telford, Chantelle Good, Roberto Campanella, Robert Glumbek, Tori Mehaffey, and William Yong. Her film credits include MTV Video Music Awards, Sweat, and Eden Planted. Passionate about creation, she choreographed for Night Shift, presented by Citadel + Compagnie/FFDN and recently collaborated with Vania Dodoo-Beals to set a work for Toronto Metropolitan University. She also assisted William Yong with setting "Utopiverse" at the National Ballet of Canada, which premiered in 2024.


